In respect of Darul Uloom, Alhamdulillah, our students achieved excellent results in the GCSE examination compared to the national statistics.

Respected Trust Members, after your valuable comments and suggestions on the draft constitution, Alhamdulillah, today we are able

to present the final version of the constitution. We have reviewed and revised the language and clauses of the draft constitution according to your suggestions and comments. Insha Allah, we aim to pass this final version of the constitution today. After the constitution is passed, we will then submit it to the Charity Commission very soon.

In respect of our Al Miraj insurance claim, we are very pleased that we have received the insurance pay-out. The Council of Management decided to keep the money we received from the insurance claim in a reserved fund or invest in new projects.

Respected Trust Members, in the past, we stated that we need more female involvement and need to ensure "women representation" and "youth and professional leadership" in the trust membership. Unfortunately, we could not find any suitable representative from women volunteers and the youth group. However, as we have a strong women volunteer's group and a recently established youth circle, in which some very dedicated youths have joined, we are very optimistic that in the near future we will be able to attract new members from our women's wing and youth.

Honourable Trust Members, the council of management has already discussed and planned to establish a girls' Madrashah. We have already viewed some suitable places for this purpose. We seek your du'a and all the support to achieve this goal.

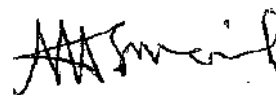

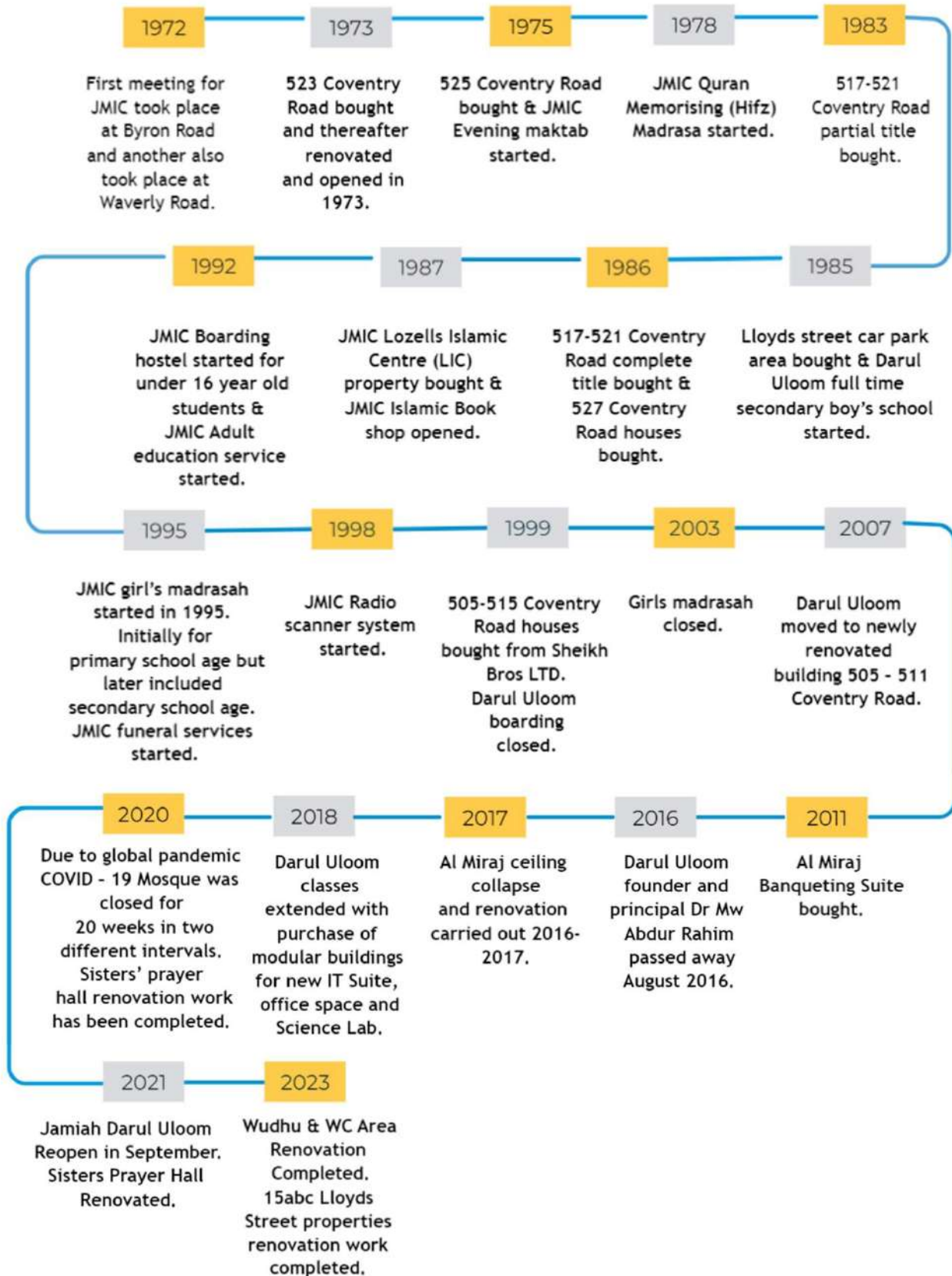

Jami Mosque has earned its well-deserved recognition as a place of spiritual solace and a hub for community cohesion. Our commitment to providing exceptional facilities for congregations, both male and female, is a testament to our unwavering dedication to fostering an inclusive and welcoming environment for all.

Throughout the entire year, JMIC's doors remain wide open, inviting individuals and communities to partake in the profound journey of individual and collective ibadah (worship). Within these hallowed walls, people from diverse walks of life gather to observe the five daily prayers, participate in the spiritually enriching Jumu'ah prayer, and engage in various enlightening lessons and lectures.

Congregational Prayers:

Throughout the year, Jami Mosque diligently carries out the fundamental practice of hosting the five daily prayers, which forms the essence of its purpose. These daily gatherings witness an attendance of approximately 1200 on average. Furthermore, the congregation swells during Friday prayers (Jumu'ah), with a regular attendance of over 1200, which surges to nearly 2000 during the busiest Fridays and holiday seasons. On a weekly basis, our mosque typically welcomes more than 14,000 visitors, and this number doubles during the holy month of Ramadan. The congregational prayers are conducted by our qualified Imams. Friday sermons are delivered by our head Imam and Khateeb. Since the decision of new khutbah policy to deliver in English, the Musallies found it very useful and engaging. This helps them to return with a clear message every Friday.

Religious Services

Achievement and Performance 2022-23



In the age of social media and technology, no one can deny the necessity of online facility of mosque services. Therefore, our activities are streamed through Mixlr, which allows people to listen using computers and smartphones. The Digital radio continued broadcasting the adhan, khutbah and talks. We stream video on Facebook, and regularly up load videos to our YouTube channel. The JMIC's sermons and talks have a wider reach in UK and abroad, especially within Bangladeshi and Pakistani community.

Ramadan, Taraweeh & Eid

Fasting began on Thursday 23rd March, and completed after 30 days, with Eid al-Fitr on Saturday 22nd April 2023. The entire month was observed with full enthusiasm and spirit to attain Taqwa. All Ramadan special programs such as the summary of the Qur'an, pre iftar discussions, ta'leem of hadith were well attended and appreciated by the musallies. A Unique welcome Ramadan program held on Sunday 12th March in Bengali and on Sunday 19th March in English.

During the full month of Ramadan, 20 Rakat taraweeh prayer was arranged in two congregations at early and late night. Many sisters attended during the night for Taraweeh

prayers. Students of Darul Uloom led taraweeh prayer along with Imams. The performance of our students was excellent and well appreciated by the congregates. Students have been given some gift as a token of appreciation by the management.

Every night during Ramadan, a special dua was conducted in the witr prayer. This created an atmosphere of haram (Makkah & Medina) and connected people to Allah.

'Eid al-Fitr was celebrated on Saturday 21st April 2023. As the weather was suitable for open air congregations, there were two big Eid gatherings in the Darul uloom car park. The first took place at 8am and the last one was at 10 am. Facilities were provided for both men and women during the Eid while the atmosphere was very welcoming. The entrances to the Eid prayer place were decorated by special balloons and children enjoyed a big bounty of different sweets. everyone who came was able to take part in the prayers.

Eid Al-Adha commenced on Wednesday 28th June 2023. Two congregations held, 8am and 10 am. Attendance at the Eid prayer is estimated to be around 7,000 people in total.



Iftar

Musallis funded for the community iftar this year. One of the extraordinary daily scenarios was the iftar arrangement for the community. The mosque iftar gatherings were attended by an average of 150 daily reaching to 500 people in some occasions. People from all walks of life took the facility to break their fast regularly which made their life easy.



Nisf Sha'ban & Laylatul Qadr

This year there were no special programs during the Nisf Sha'ban date. The masjid arranged a short talk on the importance of this blessed night. The head imam guided people about the correct method of 'Ibadah on this occasion and that was concluded by short dua of our senior Imam M Siddique Ahmed. The laylat al-Qadr night was observed greatly. Musalliies spent the special night offering isha, traweeh and tahjjud as well as spiritual talk. Sh M Shahid Ullah has explained the importance of last 5 odd nights of Rmadan and the necessity of searching for Laylat al-Qadr. A collective suhur meal was provided to the Musallis in 27th night of Ramadan.



Qur'an Summery

Qur'an stands as the final guidance of Allah for mankind. JMIC arranged a 30 days qur'an summery program as an initiative to understand this holy book. All lectures delivered by qualified ulamas throughout Ramadan. Listeners benefited from this program greatly.

Itikaf

This year 21 brothers stayed the last 10 days in the masjid performing the sunnah of itikaf. The itikaf chambers were decorated with good clothing and storage capacity. Mutakifeen were guided by Darul Uloom teacher Dr Abdul Matin. They attended regular Qur'an & tajweed lesson and had the opportunity to ask any religious questions for clarity. Mutakifeen took part in the congregational tahajud prayer during the last ten nights.



Prayer Timetable

Time table connects people with the masjid and regulates their daily routine. Every Muslim in UK needs prayer time table to offer prayers on time. Our timetable is well circulated. Approximately 5,000 colour A3 timetable are printed covering two Islamic months. The timetable is also available to view online on our website and Facebook. Mosque prayer time is regularly updated in the website and circulated through social media platforms every month.

Warm Welcome for Children on Eid Day

At Jami Mosque & Islamic Centre (JMIC), we take great joy in extending a heartfelt Eid welcome to our youngest members of the community. We believe in building strong bonds with our children,



making them feel right at home within our sacred walls of the Masjid.

On this special occasion of Eid, JMIC is delighted to distribute chocolates to our young children. Our aim is simple but profound: we want to create a warm and inviting space where children feel a sense of belonging, and where the mosque becomes a place of friendship and happiness for them.

Religious Guidance & Counselling

We have been running mosque surgery service to provide religious counselling. This usually runs twice a week on Wednesdays and Sundays. This service is open to all. The procedure is to make an appointment calling our office number and attend in due time.

Shaykh Mohmmad Shahid Ullah Azhari-the head Imam of JMIC-provides necessary Islamic counselling. This year around 150 cases are dealt. This service includes advice on marriage, talaq, family break down, social issues, children problem, disputes between individuals, and Islamic rulings on various issues. The centre has taken this service very seriously as the demand is very high from the community. We receive many calls on daily basis which needs attention, and we work towards providing solutions. Alhamdulillah, many families are saved because of good counselling.

Islam Awareness Project

The Islam Awareness Project (IAP) is committed to providing a range of services aimed at supporting new and non-Muslim individuals on their journey of discovery and understanding. Our offerings include informative classes, welcoming open days at the Mosque, distribution of the Quran and literature, engaging social gatherings, befriending services, and various other forms of support. In September 2022, we organized a successful Mosque open day, attended by approximately 30 non-Muslims, providing them with an opportunity to explore our faith and culture.

Islam Embracing Service

Jami Mosque & Islamic Centre (JMIC) is proud to offer a comprehensive conversion (reversion) service for individuals who wish to embrace Islam. We provide a supportive environment for those interested in taking the Shahada and guide them through the entire process. To streamline this journey, we have introduced the opportunity to book appointments for our "Islam Embracing Service" through our website.

This year, we were honored to witness 5 Shahadah ceremonies at our center, marking the beginning of a new chapter in these individuals' lives. In recognition of their newfound faith and to assist them on their Islamic journey, JMIC presents them with a gift bag containing essential items such as prayer mats, Quran copies, books, and other necessary resources.



Quran Distribution

In our recent Quran distribution initiative, we are delighted to report that we distributed approximately 200 copies of the Quran. Notably, a substantial portion of these, precisely 160 copies,



were distributed to non-Muslim individuals. This achievement highlights our dedication to sharing the message of Islam and ensuring the Quran is readily available to those interested in learning about it.

We are pleased to share that our website's Quran request feature has been met with an overwhelming response. Many non-Muslims have availed themselves of this opportunity to request a copy of the Quran.

Jami Mosque and Islamic Centre began an educational service by establishing the Evening Maktab in 1975. They further expanded their services to cater to the wider community by opening a Hifz Madrasah in 1978, Darul Uloom Islamic High School in 1985, and Adult education in 1992.

Achievement and performance 2022-23

A full-time college for boys aged 16 and above, offering Hifz and Alimiya programs along with A-level tuition.

Darul Uloom Islamic High School

A full-time secondary school for boys aged 11 to 16, offering national curriculum subjects along with Hifz and Alimiya courses.

Raheem Academy

which teaches children aged 6 to 16 years old how to read the Quran and Islamic Studies after school. This includes: Evening Maktab & Weekend Maktab

Adult Education

We also provide opportunities for adult members of the community to learn more about the Quran and Islam.

Jami'ah Darul Uloom

Jami'ah Darul Uloom continued providing educational services for the 2nd academic year 2022-23. Jami'ah focused on A level, Alimiyyah and Hifdh. With the limited resources Jami'ah managed to cater for quality education, provided good environment and extracurricular activities.

Students: Alhamdulillah, Jami'ah students' intake gradually increased. In 2021-22 we had 6 students in total, but in 2022-23 the number reached to 15. This year we have 14-day time students and 3 evening alimiyyah students.

Operation timing: The Jami'ah operates Monday to Friday from 9am till 4:40pm. The day is divided into two. 9-12:15pm used to be for A levels. The alimiyyah starts from 1pm and ends at 4:40.

Teachers: Well qualified teachers deliver the A level curriculum. Our A level maths and chemistry teachers is a phd in this field as well as the biology teacher. The English teacher is graduate from Birmingham university and very well qualified. The Islamic curriculum is taught by Al-Azhar graduate well experienced teachers. Eight teachers delivered the lessons in Jami'ah this year.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

AS & A Level Exams:

For the first time students appeared in AS & A level exams from Jami'ah. Three students appeared for AS exams. Two have passed while one was unsuccessful. With regards to A levels, 2 students passed the practical and one student passed English. The rest did unsatisfactory performance unfortunately. We learnt our lessons from this as it was our first experience. This year we taught English, maths, chemistry and biology.

ISLAMIC CURRICULUM (ALIMIYYAH)

Islamic curriculum has been delivered by qualified teachers. Students were taught many subjects. The subjects were Tafseer, hadith, Aqidah, Arabic language, Nahwa, sarf, Ululm al-hadith, history etc. Students have been attending the classes with much interest and enthusiasm and benefitted greatly.

Science Lab: Jami'ah facilitated a well-equipped Lab for the science practical lessons. We had to buy more 10K worth materials for the setup of the lab. The lab can be let to others and will be a source for revenue.



EXTRACURRICULAR

- Weekly speech club trained students to deliver talks and khutbas. They are passionate to deliver khutbas in masajids and other places. This is very important for dayees to be able articulate the message of deen and deliver it to others.
- Markfield visit: Students went for an educational trip to Markfield institute of higher education. They attended a lecture session, visited the library and lecture hall to get inspired by the institute.
- We enjoyed football which was arranged in a hired venue in Birmingham and ended with a collective meal in a restaurant.
- Students had opportunities to play football every week and use pool table during their breaks.
- Students were provided with lockers for the storage of their books and other valuables.
- Students had hadith essay writing competition where they have written essays regarding great hadith scholars.
- Maulana Dr Abu Yousuf, the principal of Ta'mirul Millat Madrasah Dhaka ahs visited the Jami'ah. He gave a short nassehah for our students and did dua for their success.

Fees: In Jami'ah the fees are very minimum. For A level with Alimiyyah we charge £1500 while the fees are only £1000 for Alimiyyah only. The only hifdh fees are £600 per year. This year we received the fees of £10000 from the students. On top of the above we charge £50 as admission fees and £200 for resources. The most of the cost is subsidized by JMIC.

FUTURE PLAN

- Jami'ah will introduce new subjects from the academic year 2023-24, such as Computer science and BTEC ICT. This will expand our capacity to cater for more students in future.
- Jami'ah decided to start the evening alimiyyah provision for students who have finished 2nd year of Alimi. This is to allow students to go for higher studies in universities. We have a plan to enrol students of 1st year evening Alimi which will open up opportunities for many who can't do alimi during day time.
- *Alhamdulillah*, JMIC spent a great amount of money to renovate 15 Lloyd Street for Jami'ah. The work hopefully will end soon for us to shift over there inshaAllah.
- Establishing an outstanding library for the students.



Darul Uloom Islamic High School

INTRODUCTION

Darul Uloom Islamic High School is a well-established madrassah-school which began its journey in 1985. Therefore, the school began its 38th year in September 2022 with momentum from the previous year's renewed vision, mission and values.

DARUL ULOOM SUMMARY

As trustee in charge for the Darul Uloom, I am please to report on a positive and progressive year for us at the school. There is now stability in the management and leadership of the school for three year running. Our school finance is also healthy with almost all due school fees being paid on time. Teaching standards have improved across the Alimiyah, Hifz and National Curriculum. We have done exceptionally well in our GCSE results this year, compared to previous years. This year has seen the best results to date. There is now a steady stream of year 11 students being retained to continue with their Alimiyah in our 6th form. We are also offering our students a range of social and recreational after school activities, which are eagerly taken up. Demand to study at our school is at an all time high. All our Year 7 - 9 classes are full and we also have a waiting list each year.

This year a re-inspection by the ISI was anticipated, and the SLT were well-prepared after the school's action plan was accepted in the previous academic year. The ISI inspectors visited the school on 9 December, 8:40am giving just 10 minutes notice on the day via a phone call.

During the inspection, the Independent School Inspectorate inspectors upheld an approachable demeanour and were again respectful of the school and its ethos. They were pleased with the renewed website, a new prospectus and all the improvement to 'part 6: provision of information standard'. The safeguarding criteria was recognised as strengthened; SLT were able to demonstrate that all staff had a significant amount of

safeguarding training, resulting in better practices, logs, policies and reviews. A trustee safeguarding report was also inspected, which highlighted the whole school approach to safeguarding, from both leadership and all members of staff. Requested as an action by the DfE, the trustee's essential checks were completed by the DfE according to a higher-level criterion, and it was displayed on the school's updated central record.

After a full day of inspection by two senior inspectors, the ISI confirmed all of the regulatory standards had been met, *Alhamdulillah*. DfE were informed by the ISI of the outcome, who confirmed with the school in February 2023 that there is no further action required of the school and the Darul Uloom would now fall into the regular cycle of inspections.

Ustaadh Azharul's third year ended strongly, having a pass in all areas of the ISI inspection and achieving outstanding GCSE results. Inspections in additional areas by supplementary outside agencies also passed, including inspections by the examining boards AQA and JCQ.

Leadership strongly believes the fundamentals are now almost all in place, allowing the Darul Uloom to begin focussing on refining, excelling and adorning the school, leading towards outstanding in all areas. The headteacher has presented the necessity of investment from the JMIC going forward starting in the academic year 2023/24. As a school rallying towards an outstanding status, leadership recognises the expense associated with a demand for the highest quality. It is unable to rely on simply investing through the fees to attain such a feat. Investment is required in many areas, including the upskilling and retention of high-quality staff, improvement within the curriculum, release further learning space and modernisation and development of school resources.

DAYS AND TIMES IN OPERATION

The school operates Monday to Friday from 8.30am-4.15pm for KS3 and up to 5pm for KS4. Clubs and boosters mean some KS3 pupils may leave at 5pm and KS4 pupils may be at the school till as late as 5.45pm.

The total school timings are lengthier in comparison to state run schools and academies, with 50% being used for Hifdh and Alimi Education means much less time for national curriculum education – as compared to the national average. Thus, the great consistent results of the school's GCSEs are an incredible feat considering this.

KEY CHANGES

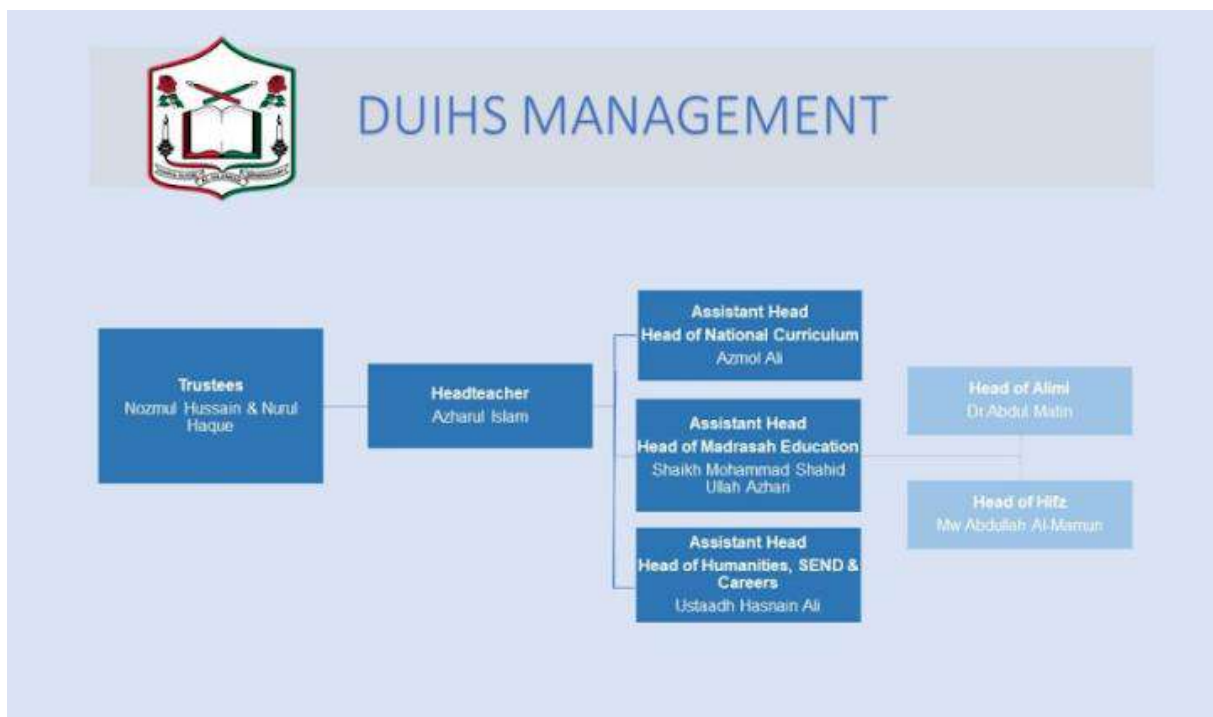
The academic year began with a new SLT member joining, Ustaadh Hasnain Ali. Alongside his role as a teacher, he is now the Head of KS3, with Ustaadh Azmol focusing on being the Head of KS4.

The behaviour policy was upgraded, requiring staff to incorporate 'SLANT', and 'SHAPE' when dealing with pupils. Our Inset days prior to the start of the new academic year focused on the application of these new strategies.

Since its introduction low level disruptions has decreased throughout the school. Using 'SLANT' and 'SHAPE' directs pupils to the correct adaab when being addressed by teachers or when answering a teacher's question. While teacher-relationships are important, they are just as important as the social climate we create in our classrooms. We want all our pupils to feel motivated and successful when receiving social cues from teachers that suggest their words are important, over their peers, and SLANT helps instil pro-social behaviours.

Alongside this, we started a new practice of issuing behaviour slips to constant rule breakers. It dictates that low-level disruptions have a consequence of 20 minutes detention without the requirement of communication to parents. It loses its effect if detentions are delayed and disrupts our behaviour management. Some parents initially questioned the practice citing inconvenience. Remaining firm, we earned parents' support, with them reprimanding their child for such detentions as the cause for the inconvenience.





In addition to termly INSET, regular staff training has been introduced, every Thursday for 30 minutes. During training, safeguarding and teaching practice are the key focus areas. This has supported better consistency and robust practices. This change will continue in the new academic year, with a stronger focus on classroom practice, Insha'Allah.

We have established a new mobile phone policy for our pupils. No Darul Uloom pupil is allowed to possess a smart phone at all, only a non-smart mobile. Previously our policy was limited to not being allowed a smart phone at school. Unfortunately, we found many issues still existed such as accessing inappropriate materials, sending rude messages on social media apps, and general misuse of time, often spending hours on TikTok/YouTube etc. at the expense of their education. Since the mobile phone policy was introduced, we have confiscated three phones to emphasise its seriousness. As a result, pupils' progress and work ethic have improved. There are no more social media related arguments and conflicts between pupils, helping to reduce overall issues to do with behaviour.

Our Dar/House system has now been fully established for all pupils and teachers, being a great motivator for pupils to excel. There are 6 houses 'Dars' which compete with one another in all areas of the school such as behaviour, competitions and fundraising. We recognised

pupils during the end of year graduation for their hard-earned points, including those who earned them for showing excellent akhlaak and adaab. Monitored by staff-based House Leaders, Houses/Dars are led by House Captains, appointed by virtue of age and ability at the beginning of the year. These captains have had the capacity to grow as leaders, especially during competitions and weekly meetings that took place every Tuesday. This year's house winners were Dar Nuh, being awarded the house winners cup during our end of year graduation.



FEES

Our current school annual fee was set in 2019 at £2,700 for Year 7 - 9 (Key stage 3) and £2900 for Year 10-11 (key stage 4). Due to increased costs in running the school, we have informed parents that we will be increasing the fee from September 2024 to £3000 for KS 3 and £3,200 for KS4 students.

The collection of fees was robust this year, Alhamdulillah. The school has moved a significant number of parents from paying monthly, to now paying termly. There is no longer an opportunity or option for monthly payments allowing better fluidity of finance collection. The remaining outstanding fees are £5,544, with parents stating they will ensure payment is cleared.

CHANGES/IMPROVEMENTS MADE THIS YEAR

Our pupils remain at the heart of everything we do. Thus, any changes and improvements must link back to supporting pupils learning, progress and safety. Changes this year include:

- A developed and thorough yearly plan was created and shared with all parents, and stakeholders giving structure to the year, and highlighting the reinforced stronger extra-curricular curriculum, truly enhancing pupils' personal development.
- New teacher routines, SLANT, SHAPE, Do Nows, etc to establish the best climate for learning;
- A weekly safeguarding assembly was introduced, alongside the existing weekly nasihah and general assembly;
- There was an introduction of a twice weekly martial arts club;



- A new Qualified Science teacher was employed replacing our previous teacher. The science curriculum was further developed adding emphasis on reviews and AFL to give pupils a stronger base;
- A recent Madinah graduate was employed, teaching Alimi, Arabic and Islamiyaat;
- An outdoor shoe rack area was built moving the shoe rack away from the reception of block b, allowing better safety, organisation and better aesthetics;

- A new part-time admin has been employed to support the main office;



- A wooden floor was fitted in the reception area;
- Further investment in ICT resources was made, 30 new PCs with up-to-date specs to manage current programs;
- A more visually improved weekly newsletter;
- Over 100 new library books purchased for the newly redeveloped library;
- A new basketball hoop was purchased alongside new bibs and footballs;
- Induction day was extended, with introductory lessons, snacks and uniform sales.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

This year was extremely positive with many beautiful achievements. These include:

- A strong student council became champions for their classes pushing through change to improve pupil experiences;
- Supersized Arabic language days continued;
- The morning adkhars were established further, where our pupils are collectively reciting in the playground;
- An amazing accomplishment where two pupils completed their memorisation of the Glorious Quran. Others were recognised for outstanding effort and progress. These pupils were given due regard and highly honoured during the Hifdh graduation receiving medals, trophies, certificates and amazing gifts

such as new PCs, monitors, speakers and mics from the community foundation;

- Previous competitions continued alongside the introduction of new ones such as:
 - Hadith and Arabic speech competition
 - Hifdh and Qiraat
 - Azaan
 - Dodge ball
 - Nahwa & Fiqh
 - Debate
 - Basketball & football
 - Tug of war & Archery
 - History & Science
 - Public speaking competition
 - Islamic Art competition
 - Spelling & Maths competition
 - General knowledge
- These competitions allowed our pupils to strengthen their existing knowledge and skills around these particular areas, sharing links within their curriculum.
- Regular delivery of Khutbahs from the pupils has been established, promoting a higher standard in the quality of Arabic amongst pupils;
- Ramadhan fundraising was great this year with teachers, parents and pupils getting behind the appeal for the new JMIC Wudu facilities;
- A Darul Uloom Year 9 pupil was a finalist, coming third place, in the National Q-Factor competition following on from last year's winner's success;
- Two of our Year 10 pupils made it to the final of a National Quran competition 'Saut Ul Quran' achieving 2nd and 3rd place, Alhamdulillah.



- Unity FM recorded a number of Quran recital and short messages from some Darul Uloom pupils;
- Seven Darul Uloom pupils have made intention to join the JMIC Jamiah Darul Uloom;



- Our Summer School restarted this year with 15 pupils attending and excelling in their Qur'an, Alhamdulillah.
- Seven pupils, and two parents performed Umrah joining our head Imam on the spiritual journey;



GCSE RESULTS FOR 2023

A fantastic set of GCSE results have been achieved by the Darul Uloom this year, Alhamdulillah. The school is grateful to the trustees and staff who supported weaker pupils through the arrangement of booster sessions. Teachers worked determinedly with pupils, giving much needed additional time after-school alongside the weekends. May Allah subhanawatalah except all their efforts.

Educational experiences, curriculum links and personal development opportunities remain at the forefront of our drive. The school organised the following:

- Pupils were highly engaged in our public speaking & debate competitions. All who participated showed courage, wit and the ability to think and react accordingly

making the program not only entertaining for pupils but more importantly a brilliant way of developing speaking and listening skills;

- Our new spelling competition got all the pupils enthusiastic and helped improve pupils' vocabulary usage;
- A Maths competition was held promoting the love of numeracy;

- Science engineering week – pupils took part in a live engineering event learning about the various elements and areas of engineering;

- UK Parliament week was an event pupils engaged in better understanding democracy. Our pupils explored the UK's democracy system, took part in quizzes and the student council planted the 'seeds of democracy' in the JMIC garden;

Richmond, to better understand democracy and question those involved in it on a day-to-day basis;



- Abolition of slavery day gave pupils an understanding of slavery in the past and in the modern day,

- Athletics day was held, promoting a range of sports competitions such as sprinting, javelin, throwing, long distance running, relay and high jumping;



- End of year graduation ceremony - pupils performed, recited, took part in plays, speeches and received awards. Parents, pupils and staff and other stakeholders of the organisation were truly blissful on the completion of the ceremony representing the end of the school year;



- Alumni Football Tournament – previous Darul Uloom pupils gathered, including graduates from the year 1999/2000 to compete in football. All former pupils that got involved enjoyed meeting their former school



- friends and teachers. The day ended with food in the JMIC, allowing teachers and former pupils to catch up with one another, Alhamdulillah.



EXTERNAL VISITORS/VISITS

Engaging with others is a key drive to support pupils' personal development, to help widen their thinking, and to build resilience against radicalisation. A number of visits and visitors were organised with this in mind, including:

- Pupils meeting and speaking to two members of the House of Lords, taking part in an organised dialogue known as 'Learn with the Lords'.



- Islamic heritage fair/mosque open day at the JMIC. Pupils explored Islamic items, beliefs and historical facts;
- A Birmingham university visit took place, where pupils explored the campus, along with all the subjects on offer and questioned the grade requirements to join;
- A Markfield institute visit, where pupils understood the Islamic studies degrees on offer, which they may want to pursue in the future;



- Apprentice Show visit, in Coventry's famous Ricco stadium. Pupils met and spoke to apprenticeship providers. They also managed to build the tallest tower as part of a competition winning some small prizes;
- Seerah conference; helping pupils remember our beloved Prophet ﷺ, and recite his praises;
- Madinatul Uloom visit during a football match, exploring the school premises and meeting their teachers;
- A local Businessman visited, who inspired all the pupils to learn the deen to become the best at business;





- Barrister visit, where our pupils were taught the fundamentals of the law system in the UK, and how solicitors and barristers work within it;



- Police visit, arranged under the banner of 'youth café', where pupils discussed the difficult issues that are prevalent in their



- Ninja Warrior Centre, giving pupils an avenue to hone their physical skills as well as to burn their energy with loads of fun;



- Year 11 Drayton Manor trip after GCSEs, with pupils relaxing from exams and bonding with one another including teachers;



- Apprenticeship workshop, where a speaker who delivers apprenticeships gave information on the benefits of joining an apprenticeship;



- Dragons' Den competition, which gave pupils opportunities to present their business ideas to a panel consisting of two visitors and a teacher;
- A residential trip to Pioneers centre where pupils stayed two nights taking part in activities such as high ropes, abseiling, football and orienteering alongside a structured nasihah sessions. We also gathered to support England in the world cup!
- Pupils visited different religious institutes including a local church and a Shia Mosque to understand differences in the community and the importance of building better cohesion;
- Solutions Not Sides – This was a workshop included an Israeli and a Palestinian speaker sharing their views on the conflict surrounding Palestine with pupils listening to both sides views and then questioning them;
- Careers week where professionals such as the RAF, doctors, university students, a carpenter, lawyers and accountants spoke to pupils in the JMIC community hall explaining how to get into their specific fields and what their job entail;

- Virtual 'meet an author' event – KS3 were joined a live webinar with the children's author Candy Gourlay and were able to ask her questions about becoming a writer;



- NCS speaker delivered a presentation to Year 11 pupils regarding the highly acclaimed National Citizenship Award;
- Trustee visit – Staff and pupils met the trustee in charge of the school getting familiar with the governance and putting a face to the name. The trustee spent valuable time talking to leadership, teachers and pupils getting a real feel of the school environment, ethos and culture.



EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITY

Clubs are a vital part of the school's overall environment allowing pupils to pursue their passions and to excel in a certain area, these include:

- Martial Arts club established, where pupils learn the art of self-defence with a black-belt instructor twice a week;
- Graphic design club replaced last year's art club;
- Football club for KS3/KS4 – Pupils were able to practice their skills before ending each session with a competitive match. Football matches against other schools also took place, including matches against Hamd House, Eden Boys and Madinatul Uloom;

- Basketball club for KS3/KS4. Pupils are preparing for future competitions against other schools;
- Cricket club for KS3/KS4 including having a match against a local school;



- Poetry project, pupils created amazing poetry which has been placed on the school walls;
- Media team, where pupils have been taught how to record videos/pictures of school events, editing them to make them



- Ramadhan Reminders – Pupils created short videos delivering nasihah for Ramadhan to parents and pupils;
- Media/English project – Pupils created naseehah videos, and practiced video editing by creating their own adverts;

STAFFING

This year we recruited a qualified Science teacher & a former Darul Uloom pupil, now a graduate of Madinah University as an Alimi/Arabic teacher in term 1.

The school hosts an array of qualified teachers bringing higher standards in all areas of the school's teaching and learning, Alhamdulillah.

NUMBER OF STUDENTS- CLASSES

The number of pupils fluctuate this year, starting with a higher number but ending at 131 pupils. This was due to parents' financial difficulties, and for some pupils, their behaviour let them down. Our Year 7 demand remains strong, Alhamdulillah.

TEACHER TRAINING

PREMISES

Having a suitable premises is essential for running the best operation. We recognise the important need for constant improvement alongside maintenance. This year some work has been unplanned but necessary and other works took place as part of overall growth; this includes:

- Block B – Wooden Floor installed;
- Block B – Toilet doors securing;
- Block C – Rotting wooden beams replaced in the main multi-purpose hall;
- Science lab electrical emergency stop button installed;
- Concrete walls in the playground secured;
- Damp walls/paint repainted with damp proof paint;
- Block B – Boiler replaced;
- Block B - Shoe rack area was removed and an outdoor shoe area has been built
- Block B – Tiles in wudu area repaired;
- ICT lab – 30 new PCs purchased.

The headteacher has requested the trustees to invest in new signage for the front of the school, clearly stating it is a secondary school, as often members of the public visit the school reception asking about the Jami Mosque. The front of the school is dilapidated, but with some light skimming and paint it can look elegant.

Our reception waiting area needs uplifting in order to give the best first impressions. After research and inquiry with companies, the total cost to do this work ranges from £7500 to £10000.



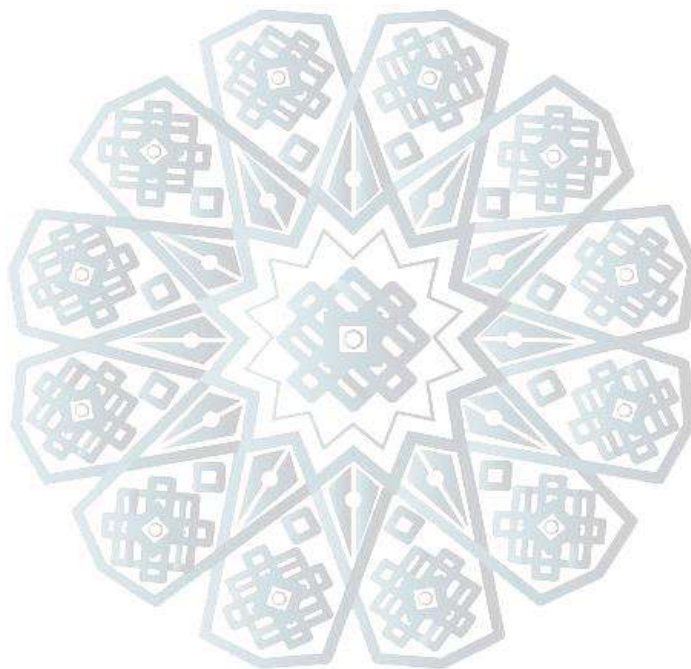
CONCLUSION

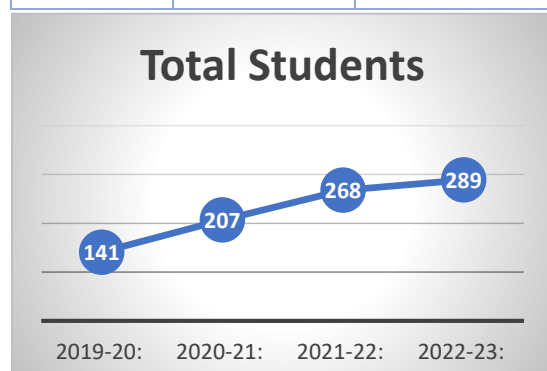

This institution has been serving the community since 1975 and continues to grow in its efforts to provide quality Islamic education to young students. The Evening Maktab, the foundation of our educational services, started in 1975. Over the years, it has evolved into Raheem Academy, expanding its offerings to encompass a broader range of educational services. We are proud to have nurtured thousands of young students, imparting knowledge in Quranic studies, Qaidah, Islamic studies, Adab, and Akhlaq. This year, we are catering to 285 students, and this number continues to increase. Our commitment remains unwavering in providing the best quality education to our children.



Number of Students

Last year, our Evening Maktab had a total of 203 students. This year, we are pleased to report an increase of 12 students, reaching a total of 250 enrolled students.

Achievements:

In the past year, we celebrate the accomplishments of our students:

23 boys and 15 girls successfully completed the recitation of the Holy Quran.

Fees

In the financial year spanning from April 2022 to March 2023, Raheem Academy received a total of £101,274.39 in fees from both Evening Maktab and Weekend Maktab. This signifies a substantial increase from the previous year, where our total revenue was £74,453. As we continue to welcome new students and expand our services, we anticipate further growth in the coming year. Insha'Allah, we are expecting approximately £120,000 in revenue for the upcoming year.

Future Plans

Alhamdulillah, we are thrilled to share that Raheem Academy has experienced a surge in demand, clearly demonstrated by a significant waiting list of eager students seeking enrolment. However, we have encountered constraints related to classroom space and the availability of qualified teachers, which have limited our capacity to accommodate new students.

Insha'Allah, we are excited to announce that our new academic building is nearing completion, with an expected finish date in October. This development marks a pivotal moment in our journey to expand and enhance our educational services. As part of our proactive approach to meeting the growing demand for quality Islamic education, we are actively planning to open 5 new classes in the near future. These additional classes will enable us to serve more children, providing them with access to the enriching and enlightening experience of Raheem Academy.

Parent-Teacher Meetings

In accordance with our academic calendar, we organized three parent-teacher meetings, one for each term, over the course of the academic year. These meetings served as important opportunities for parents to receive comprehensive reports on their child's progress and academic performance. Additionally, we actively sought feedback from parents during these meetings to gauge their perspectives on their child's development and overall experience.



Monthly Assemblies

Throughout the academic year, our monthly assemblies were a consistent and cherished part of our educational program. In total, we organized eight assemblies during this academic year, each held on a monthly basis and featured a variety of student presentations, including recitations, hadith with interpretations, nasheed performances, speeches, and role-playing. To recognize and encourage outstanding achievements, merit certificates were awarded to students each month for their exceptional performance. Moreover, we always extended invitations to the parents of our top-performing students, allowing them to partake in the celebrations and share in their children's accomplishments.



Art & Calligraphy Competition

In December 2022, we organized an inspiring Art & Calligraphy competition for our Raheem Academy students. Participants were tasked with creating artwork centered around themes like the Kaaba, mosques, Islamic landmarks, and Islamic artifacts. In the current year, Raheem Academy has conducted three teachers' training sessions as part of our commitment to continuous improvement and professional development. These training sessions aim to enhance the skills and knowledge of our teaching staff, ensuring the highest quality of education for our students. Through these sessions, our educators are better equipped to provide a nurturing and enriching learning environment.

WEEKEND MAKTAB

Raheem Academy Weekend Maktab passed a successful year. We had 70 students, increasing about 10 from previous year.

Alhamdulillah, this year, 20 boys and 10 girls' students have finished the Holy Qur'an. 18 boys and 10 girls' have completed the Noorani Qaidah and have now moved on to the Qur'an. The remaining students are on Qaidah and Qur'an.

At the moment, onsite we are running 1 boys class and 1 girls class. We are opening Hifz class from September inshaAllah. Next month we are opening one boys' class. Our plan is to increase 3 more classes this year inshaAllah.

Adult Education

The Jami Mosque and Islamic Centre (JMIC) places a strong emphasis on providing educational services for members of the community, including adults. JMIC recognizes the importance of educating individuals of all ages in understanding the basics of Islam and practicing it accurately. This report outlines some of the key adult education initiatives and programs offered by JMIC.

Adult Tajweed for Brothers

JMIC initiated the Tajweedul Quran course for brothers in 2021. This course, currently conducted by Maulana Siddique Ahmed, focuses on teaching the proper pronunciation and recitation of the Quran. The course begins with the Qaidah (basic Quranic Arabic) and gradually progresses to advanced Tajweed rules. In the past year, Eight brothers successfully moved on to the Quran from Qaidah, while Five others completed the entire course.

Tajweedul Quran for Sisters (Starting September 2023)

Recognizing the importance of providing educational opportunities for sisters, JMIC is planning to launch a Tajweedul Quran course for sisters starting in September 2023. The course will be taught by Ustadah Salam Akhter, a teacher from the Raheem Academy. This initiative aims to empower sisters with the knowledge of Quranic pronunciation and recitation.

Ta'leem of hadith: Short ta'leem of hadith takes place from Tuesday to Thursday after zuhar prayer. M Siddique Ahmed, M Abdullah Suhel and Sh Shahid Ullah deliver the ta'leem from Riyaad al-Saliheen, the famous hadith book of Imam al-Nabawi. Ta'leem is conducted in mixed community languages i.e. Bengali, Urdu and English. In average 15 people attend the ta'leem regularly.

Tafseerul Qur'an: To connect the community with the book of Allah tafseer al-Qur'an program plays a great role. Jami mosque has two tafseer sessions every week. On Saturdays after zuhar prayer Sh Habibul Gaffar delivers the

tafseer in English. Every Sunday after asr prayer M Nurul Haque delivers the tafseer in Bengali and English. Both sessions are contributing towards enhancing the Musallis knowledge about the book of Allah. The number of attendees varies time to time from 10-15 people in average.



Wednesday Talabul 'Ilm program: This program has been in operation for nearly 2 years. This weekly program sits at the fore front of the adult education. The program is comprised of two sessions and conducted in Bengali language. Qur'an Tafseer has been delivered in the revelation order and fiqh is discussed in an orderly manner followed by Q&A. Food has been provided fortnightly with the contribution of the participants. This program became a means of learning Islam as well as social gathering for the musalleis. In average 80 people attend every session.



The journey of this program started from Wednesday 9th February 2022. Shaykh M Shahid Ullah Azhari delivers Tafseer and fiqh

lessons and answers the questions dedicatedly every week. The program is very much appreciated by the Musallis and they want the continuation of it for their benefit.

Weekend Alimiyyah: Under the banner of Raheem Academy a part time Alimiyyah course was delivered over 2 years from July 2021. The course has focused mainly on three subjects. Arabic language, fiqh and seerah. We taught the students Arabic reading, writing and speaking from different books. They have completed chapters of taharah and salah from fiqh as-Sunnah book. As for the seerah they have completed the book named 'when the moon is splited. In 2nd year, we covered the history of khulafa al-Rashedun along with Arabic text, grammar and fiqh.

Community Services

Achievement and performance 2022-23

Since its inception in 1973, JMIC has been steadfast in its commitment to serving the community. Over the years, we have expanded our offerings to encompass a diverse range of services, including Islamic Funeral Services, Nikah & Civil Marriages, Broadcast Services, and more. In this annual report, we are proud to present an overview of our continuous efforts and contributions to the community throughout the past year. The detailed services report demonstrates our consistent growth, with each service showing an increase compared to previous years.

Marriage service

"Allah said: Marry those of you who are single, whether men or women, and those of your male and female slaves who are righteous. If they are poor, Allah will enrich them out of His Bounty. Allah is Immensely Resourceful, All-Knowing. (Surah An-Nur, Ayat: 32)

This verse illustrates that Muslims should ensure that no one in society remains unmarried. Family members, friends, and neighbors should all take a keen interest in this matter.

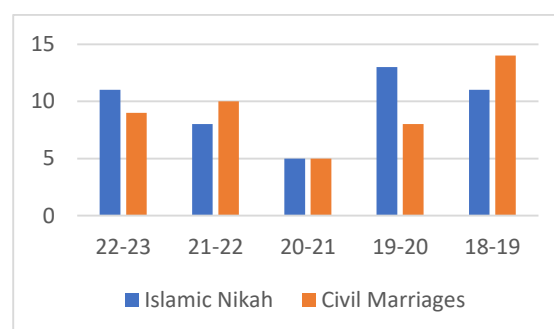
This underscores that the process of marriage, an obligatory act in Islam that the Prophets also adhered to, is the only way to sustain the world until its end.

JMIC has long been a center providing several essential community services, with conducting marriages being one among many. It not only

accommodates marriages but also facilitates both Islamic Nikkah and Civil Marriage ceremonies in the same venue, and then guides them next door to Al Miraj Banqueting Hall saving the community further costs and making the whole process more efficient and seamless for newlyweds.

The numbers are gradually returning to normal following a period of apparent lull due to the pandemic. This year, we performed 11 Islamic marriages and 9 Civil marriages, both significantly higher numbers compared to last year, when we conducted 8 Civil marriages and 10 Islamic Nikkah ceremonies, respectively."

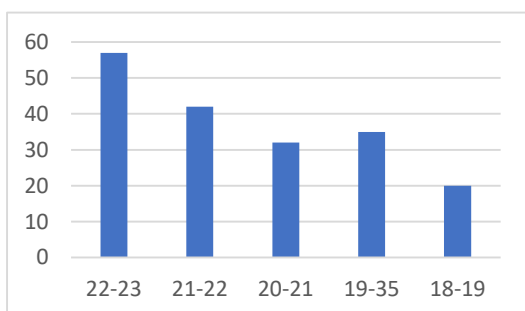
Broadcast Services

In May 2020, we launched an online radio service accessible via our website. To date, more than 10,000 people have tuned in to our online radio. This year, we installed a Digital Radio system that provides crystal-clear audio quality, accessible via wifi. We sold 20 wifi-based digital radios.

Furthermore, we are actively working on implementing several other platforms and apps that will enable us to reach a broader audience.

Islamic Funeral Services

Arranging a funeral can be a daunting task when the mind is overwhelmed with grief. We provide essential funeral services during the most difficult times for the deceased's family. Our services include body collection from homes or hospitals, providing washing

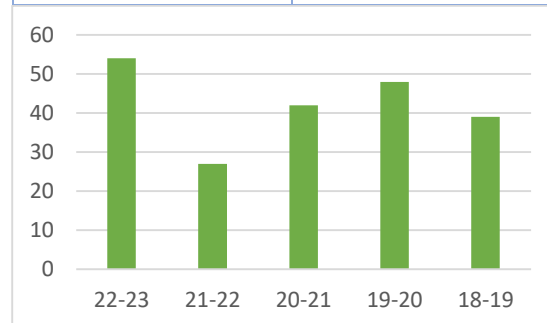
facilities, body preservation, and organizing Janazah and burial.

This year, the funeral department provided its services to 25 males, 28 females, and 1 child, totalling 54 deceased individuals, which is double the number from the previous year, which was 27. Alhamdulillah.

We have received significant support from our volunteer sisters who consistently participate in bathing deceased females. This selfless contribution is invaluable, as they offer assistance whenever a funeral for a deceased female occurs, without any desire for material gain.

Youth Service

JMIC partnership with the Community Foundation and Muslim Community Association (West Midlands) has benefitted our children and young people greatly over the years.

Holiday Activity Club

Community Foundation provided four weeks summer holiday scheme from 1 August – 25 August 2022 and also a week winter scheme from 19th December to 22 December 2022. The holiday activity club was open to children from all our musalli, however booking priority is first given to children attending our Maktab and Darul Uloom. The scheme was open Monday - Thursday for primary aged boys and girls in the morning and secondary aged children in the afternoon. We had capacity for 200 children each day who were supervised by six full time staff paid by Community Foundation. Children were given free healthy breakfast and lunch each day along with a range of sports coaching such as cricket coaching provided by Warwickshire Cricket Board, hockey coaching provided by England Hockey Board, golf coaching provided by the Golf Foundation. In addition, children also played football, basketball and rounders. For some children, some of the sports were the



first time they played them. We were supported by Community Foundation to purchase a range of sports equipment for the madrasa such as hockey sticks and equipment, golf clubs and equipment, cricket equipment, professional basketball hoops and balls, footballs goals and balls, rounders equipment and netballs. This equipment are now made available to use by YMO boys and the Darul Uloom students.

In addition to sports sessions, children also had fun energiser games, PE, growing our own vegetables, arts and crafts. We also organised weekly free day trips by coach for the children and their family to West Midlands Safari Park, Drayton Manor Theme Park, Blackpool beach and Dovedale in the Peak District for a scenic cross country walk, all of which were highly enjoyed by all the children and parents.



Sunday Youth Group

Working in partnership with the Muslim Community Association, we have been running weekly sports and activities along with Islamic circles every Sunday for YMO (boys youth group), Muslimaat (girls youth group) and JMC (primary school aged children). The youth groups are now seeking to get the disused porta cabin operational so they can have their sessions in their own dedicated space.

Computer Gifts

To encourage our maktab and madrasa students to excel in education and engage with JMIC, we were supported by Community Foundation to provide 8 new computers to students who came top of their class and those who completed their Hifz. Three computers were also donated to the Maktab for students who came top of their class.

Fajr Knight Challenge

In an effort to engage and inspire our youth to become active members of the mosque, we launched the 'Fajr Knight Challenge' during the winter holiday in December 2022. This innovative initiative spanned over 10 days, offering our young participants a unique and enriching experience.

Our dedicated youth embraced this opportunity by consistently attending the Fajr prayers at the mosque. They demonstrated their spiritual prowess by engaging in Qirat and delivering thought-provoking speeches after the Fajr prayer. These activities not only strengthened their connection to the Quran but also encouraged them to share their insights with the community.

Weekends during the challenge were a time for physical activity and camaraderie. The boys enthusiastically participated in various games, including tug of war, archery, word memorizing challenges, and balloon popping, among others. These games fostered teamwork, sportsmanship, and healthy competition. One of the highlights of the challenge was the shared breakfasts on weekends.

In total, 41 boys wholeheartedly embraced the Fajr Knight Challenge. Their dedication and enthusiasm were truly inspiring, making this initiative a resounding success. It not only deepened their connection to the mosque but also instilled a sense of responsibility and belonging within our youth.

To recognize their exceptional efforts, we awarded the top performer with a tablet as a prize for achieving a 100% score. Additionally, all other participants were acknowledged and honored with gifts and certificates for their participation and dedication to the Fajr Knight Challenge.

JMIC Seniors Club

Home Visits:

We continue our commitment to visiting the homes of senior members who, due to sickness or old age, are unable to attend activities at the mosque. In the past year, we have conducted home visits for four senior musallis. These visits allow us to maintain a strong connection with our elderly members, ensuring they feel valued and supported.



Tea Circle:

Commencing in October 2022, the Tea Circle has been a regular gathering every Tuesday, providing a welcoming space for our senior community members. Approximately 20 seniors actively participate in these gatherings, fostering connections and creating a sense of belonging within the community.



Awareness Program:

On Tuesday, 7th February 2023, during one of our Tea Circle gatherings, we organized a special awareness program in collaboration with the Community Foundation. Brother Nozmul Hussain delivered an informative talk and presentation about 'Post Covid syndrome' or 'long Covid.' This program aimed to educate our senior members about the potential health effects of Covid-19 and provide them with valuable insights into managing their health post-recovery.

The JMIC Seniors Club initiatives underscore our commitment to the well-being and social engagement of our elderly community members. We look forward to continuing these efforts, ensuring that our seniors have the support, companionship, and knowledge they need to lead fulfilling lives within our community.



JMIC Women's Wing

One of the most active and vital components of the Jami Mosque & Islamic Centre is the Women's Wing. Since the renovation of the Sisters' Prayer Hall in 2020, the engagement of sisters in our Masjid has been steadily increasing. Sisters have been actively participating in events held at JMIC.

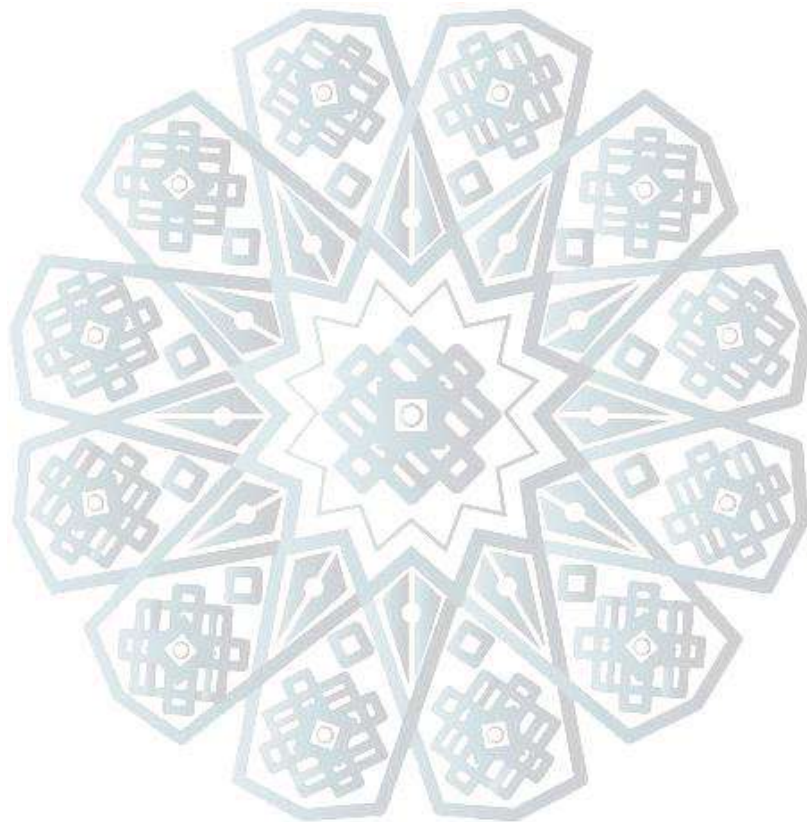
Volunteering:

The Foodbank initiative at JMIC has been in operation for the past three years and is actively working on expanding its outreach to a broader community. Currently, we distribute food supplies to two locations either once or twice a month. These locations include the City Mission Care Centre, situated in Birmingham City Centre, providing shelter for 96 homeless individuals, and St. Anne's Hostel in Highgate Birmingham, accommodating 37 homeless individuals.

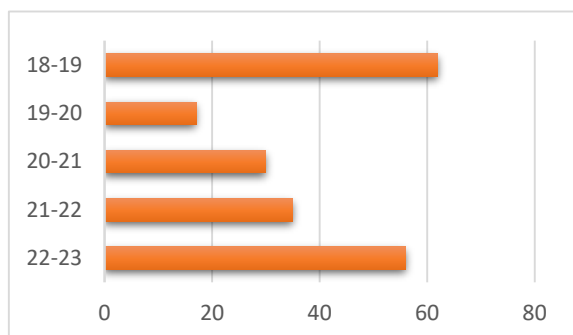
Our food collection for the Foodbank is made possible through the generous support of the Fair Share scheme, in partnership with Tesco at Swan Island and Tesco in Sheldon. Following the food collection, our committed team of volunteers, led by our Trust member Mr. Jamil Ahmed, diligently sorts and arranges the food items before delivering them to the previously mentioned centers. Moreover, every Sunday, JMIC sets up a well-stocked food table, generously supplied with essential items, to assist local community members in need.

Charitable Services for External Organizations

JMIC has consistently provided access to external charities from around the world to raise funds for humanitarian and welfare projects. This support is extended every Monday in the Mosque and every night after Taraweeh prayer during the month of Ramadan. Over the past few years, JMIC has significantly contributed to the success of numerous charitable organizations:

JMIC actively participates in raising funds for humanitarian crises, both locally and internationally, through partnerships with reputable organizations. Some of our recent contributions include:

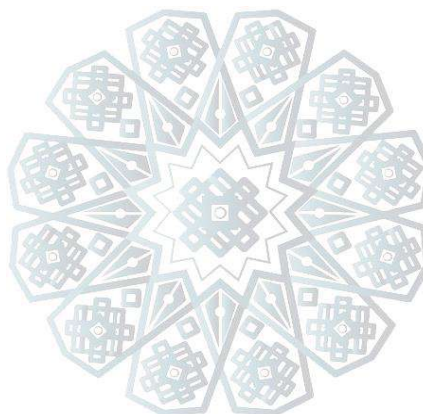

Premises Report

Wudhu Area Renovation Work

Alhamdulillah, we are pleased to report the successful completion of the Wudhu & Toilet area renovation project. This project aimed to modernize and enhance the facilities available to our congregants and visitors. These renovations were completed in time for Ramadan 2023, and the new Wudhu area is now fully operational.

The renovated Wudhu area boasts a range of modern amenities, including 21 seating Wudhu facilities, 13 toilet cubicles, two shower rooms, two hexagon standing Wudhu facilities accommodating up to 12 users each, four basins, and six hand dryers. These facilities have been designed with user comfort and convenience in mind.

In addition to these practical enhancements, the Wudhu area now features underfloor heating, contemporary tiling, and drinking water facilities, ensuring a comfortable and hygienic experience for all users. Its spacious design allows more than 50 people to use the area simultaneously, accommodating the needs of our growing community.



We are truly grateful for the support and contributions from our generous donors. The feedback from our service users and congregants has been overwhelmingly positive, with everyone expressing their appreciation for the high-quality renovation work. Alhamdulillah, We are proud to have created a modern, comfortable, and welcoming Wudhu area for all.

Classroom Expansion Project:

In addition to the successful Wudhu & Toilet area renovation, Our Centre is also making significant progress on the Classroom Expansion Project at our school premises. This project is a testament to our commitment to education and community development.

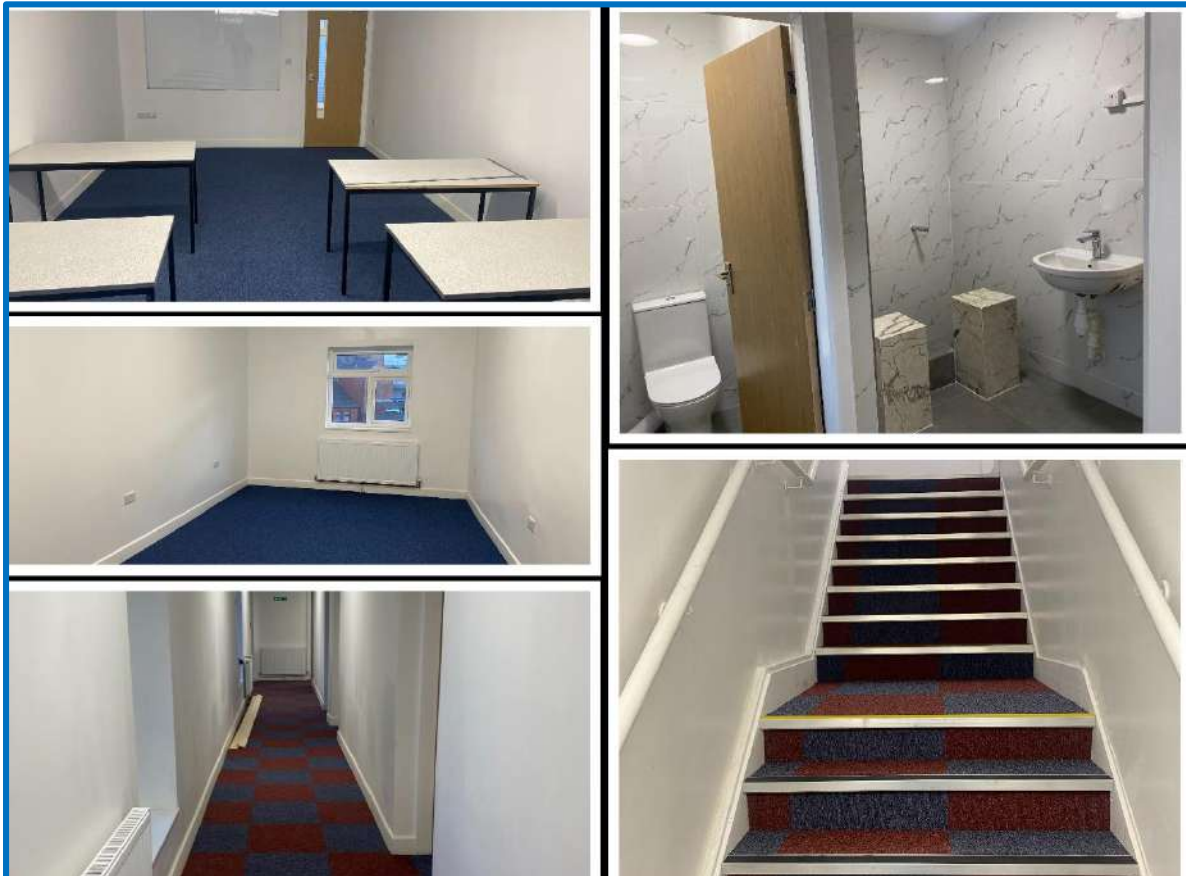

Maintenance Report

Alhamdulillah, we are pleased to report that we have successfully completed around 200 repair and maintenance tasks at the Masjid premises. Notable highlights of our efforts include:

CCTV System Enhancement: We have significantly improved our security infrastructure by modifying the CCTV system within the sisters' prayer hall and A-block. In addition, a brand-new CCTV system has been installed in the recently renovated Wudhu Area, ensuring comprehensive surveillance coverage.

Painting: We have enhanced the visual appeal of our premises by conducting painting work in the sisters' prayer halls, as well as refreshing the paint on several other walls.

Sign Board & Signage: A 3D metal sign displaying the name "Jami Mosque & Islamic Centre Birmingham" was affixed to the main Masjid wall, serving as a prominent and easily recognizable identifier for the mosque. Moreover, a waterproof sign was positioned at the car park gate to improve accessibility and offer clear guidance to visitors. Additionally, a signboard was erected for "Jamiah Darul Uloom & Raheem Academy" at the Lloyd St. property, facilitating the identification of the educational institution. To enhance safety and organization, we also installed caution and car park signs throughout the car park area.



DU Repair & Maintenance work

In addition to the wear and tear work, several maintenance tasks were performed within the DU premises.

- Modified the DU entrance and shoe rack, creating a waiting room for parents.
- Renovated the DU library room with new laminated flooring, shelving, and painting.
- Painted various classrooms and toilet areas within the DU premises.
- Replaced the carpets in the server room.
- Fitted new science equipment with a required drainage system in the science room.
- Installed outdoor light systems in the playground and changed the boiler.
- Set up two table tennis tables for DU students.

BOOKING SUMMARY

In 2022-2023, Al-Miraj ensured 236 bookings successfully. However, 15 bookings had been canceled for family reasons. But our nonrefundable policy prevents us from refunding their deposit money.

2023-2024: according to the 16th of August 2023 booking report; Al Miraj ensured more than 161 bookings till the 6th of August 2024. Where we have successfully completed 82 functions.

INSURANCE CLAIM: In 2017 we lost a good amount of profit and lost our reputation as well. The insurance claim has taken a couple of years to decide the consequences. Finally, by the grace of almighty Allah, our claim has been partially successful.



Finance: 2022-2023 financial year was busy and one of the most profitable years. Al Miraj smoothly dealt with several difficulties and secured 232 functions that generated a good financial flow throughout this year complying with all the government requirements. In this year Al-Miraj received hall booking income is £397,619.00

IMPROVEMENTS

Price: The price for the venue hire has been increased by £300 to £800 in both packages.

Decoration: we are trying to improve some areas to attract our customers. For example, we have designed 4/6 types of new Arch-

chandelier walkways. The cost was only £2000.00 but it will generate £150-350 extra on each order. Almost 15 customers have included this item in their booking. Moreover, A nikah partition will be created soon that will also add £150-250 profit in each function. A couple of table centerpieces have been introduced to modify our exclusive package as well.

Extra Profit sources: We sell different external services where we do not have any investments, but we make a profit. For instance: a chocolate fountain, dessert table, fruit table, dry smoke, sparkler, and so on.

Others: In the gent's toilet, a 'Wudhu area' is being installed which is essential for the Asian wedding venue. Moreover, at the back car park, the fire exit door will be converted by a new lobby soon. The council also approved creating this new lobby. In Addition. We have several plans to improve other essential services that we have mentioned in the next discussion.

MARKETING REPORT

Al Miraj did not have any marketing sources except our websites. The existing website conveys general information only. However, we have started online marketing by posting regular videos and shorts, on TikTok, Instagram, Facebook, and YouTube. Video posting has increased since the new office assistant joined. The highest number of positive feedbacks is 50000+ views we have achieved from TikTok. The full service is operated by the office itself without any cost. Furthermore, 'Google reviews' are more than 850+ now. And it plays a vital role as a marketing source to attract our new customers. The good services, trustworthy commitments, and authentic information helped to achieve this recognition.

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES & DEVELOPMENTS

According to the Al Miraj 'service standard' and 'business location', it has a lot of business opportunities nowadays. Therefore, a modern and updated service style is mandatory to attract the younger generations. And, in this

modern business field the competitors are very smart and aware thus if we fail or delay taking the opportunities, the competitors will certainly take over anytime. Consequently, Al Miraj will fail to attract its customers in the future. Therefore, the revenue and reputation will gradually decrease, which will be very difficult to recover. So, the most important opportunities and development areas are included below in the bullet point.

- **Decoration:** Comparatively other venues maintain and use all the latest decorations to attract modern customers. In this area we are not that well updated thus we need to improve and invest in this sector. It is true that wedding events always demand attractive decorations.
- **Modernization:** to stay in the modern business field, contemporary modern facilities are essential. Therefore, we need to renovate and install some modern facilities as soon as possible. For example, a good sound system, shivery chair, high-quality heating and air-cooling system, modern decorations and interior design, a modern kitchen, a modern reception area with a receptionist, ceiling decoration with modern lighting, extra storage facilities, reorganizing the car park, and so on. We are collecting quotations from different companies for the above needs.
- **Service availabilities:** generally, a wedding function connects with a lot of business opportunities. As an old and popular venue in Birmingham, Al Miraj has a number of opportunities to increase its business area. Therefore, a well-organized administration can create more innovative ideas that will help to generate more profits and will ensure sustainable business growth in the future too.
- **Others:** Furthermore, our car park is big enough thus we can renovate a full car park where we can use some advertising signs. Our venue location is awesome. So, if we can utilize it as a marketing source by decorating and



installing some LED lights on Al-Miraj's name, the marketing will start from our land.

BARRIER

- Dhul and fireworks are the common barriers to losing some customers. However, we are trying to comply by requesting our customers to play it inside the hall.
- Unclear guidelines that impact the full circle of our working system.
- Uncertain yearly plan and budget

PROPOSALS

- Specifically, skilled workers for specific positions can provide quality service and innovative ideas that are immensely important in this wedding market. Besides that, it will generate more profit every month and the business will be sustainable for the next 100 years.

To conclude, there is no doubt that innovation and modernization are mandatory requirements to secure a sustainable business. Therefore, the above development will secure the contemporary market demand. Otherwise, the present sales and profit will gradually reduce in the future, which would be very difficult to recover.

Lozells Islamic Centre

We have been able to continue providing regular services as both a Masjid and an Islamic Centre. The Centre has a capacity for over 150 people and offers daily prayers, Jummah Prayer, Eid Prayers, and various activities during Ramadan. It also operates an Evening Madrasah, a weekly Tafsir program, and various other Islamic activities.

Lailatul Qadr

The Centre organized Darsul Quran, talks, Quiamullail, and Suhoor for about 100 people. The night concluded with Duaa. The Centre also arranged special gatherings and programs throughout the year featuring the local Imam and guest scholars.

Ramadan

Over 150 people attended the Tarawih prayer led by two Huffaz. After each Taraweesh session, our Imam provided an explanation of the recited Quranic verses.

Eid Prayers

We arranged two Eid Jama'ahs for both Eid-ul-Fitr and Eid-ul-Adha.

Tafsirul Quran / Tarbiah Programme

The Tafsirul Quran Mahfil is held once a month with guest scholars and our local Imam.

Evening Madrasah

The Evening Madrasah operates from Monday to Friday, 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm, serving approximately 20 students who are taught by our Imam.

Dawah Activities / Youth Group

Every Thursday and Saturday, we host Tarbiyah and Dawah circles at the Centre."

Card Payment System Upgrade

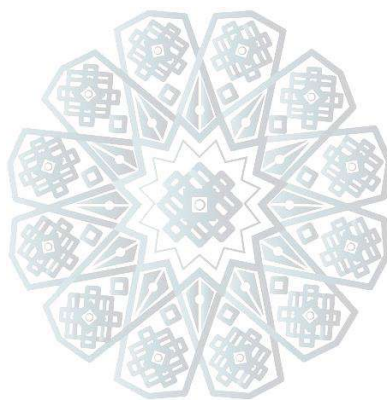

Finance & Fundraising Committee

This report serves as a comprehensive overview of the Finance & Fundraising Committee's endeavors and achievements at our Mosque over the year. It is our pleasure to share with you the dedication of our community members, the generosity of our donors, and the impact of our collective efforts in sustaining and enhancing our beloved Mosque. This report highlights the milestones we have reached and sets the stage for our continued commitment to the betterment of our Mosque and its mission.

Wudhu Area Renovation Appeal 2023

We have conducted two appeals for our Wudhu area renovation project, in 2019 and 2023, securing a commitment of £189,078.40. To date, we have received 73% of these funds, and Alhamdulillah, we have successfully completed the Wudhu renovation project work.

Iftar Meal Appeal 2023

Each year, we organize Iftar arrangements for our local community members. We appealed to our fellow Muslims to sponsor one day of full Iftar meals, which cost approximately £300. We are grateful to report that 30 individuals generously sponsored 30 days of Iftar meals.

Classroom Expansion Project Appeal 2022

During Ramadan 2022, we launched a fundraising appeal for our classroom expansion project, securing a commitment of £75,547.78. To date, we have received 78% of this commitment, marking significant progress in this endeavor.

Utility Appeal 2022

As our utility costs tripled compared to previous years, we initiated a 'Utility Appeal 2022' in December 2022, reaching out to our congregants. Our appeal offered options of one day utilities at £200, half a day at £100, 5

days at £100, and 10 days at £2,000. Alhamdulillah, we received commitments totalling £12,000 from 50 individuals, with 85% of the committed funds already paid.

Online Donation System & Crowdfunding

Since 2020, we have implemented a card payment system and enabled online donations through our website. These methods have become increasingly popular among donors, resulting in approximately £40,000 in donations received via card payments, website contributions, and other online platforms. In this year, we also embraced crowdfunding to expand our outreach to well-wishers who may not be regular mosque attendees or local residents. During the Ramadan Appeal, we successfully raised over £13,000 through the Crowdfunding platform.

Donor Appreciation Calls & Gifts

We remain committed to maintaining contact with our donors through phone calls, letters, and emails to express our gratitude and keep them informed about our projects and activities. Additionally, we have expressed our appreciation by offering gifts to selected donors and well-wishers, fostering stronger relationships with the Mosque community.

Gift Aid

We are pleased to report that we received £33,713.14 from Gift Aid claims for the year 2021-22. Furthermore, we have already submitted the necessary documents for the year 2022-23, awaiting confirmation.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to our community members and donors for their unwavering support, which has enabled us to achieve our fundraising goals and successfully carry out essential projects. We eagerly anticipate continued support as we work towards serving our community and maintaining our Mosque facilities.

Media Committee

Our dedicated media team continues to play a crucial role in fostering community engagement by providing services and spreading the message of dawah through various media channels. The Media Committee takes the responsibility of scrutinizing all public communications to ensure that they align with the Centre's core values and goals, thereby preserving its positive public image.

Key highlights for the year, as covered in our annual report, encompass the following:

- We maintained an active presence on various social media platforms, ensuring timely updates on various issues, including appearances on TV channels like NTV, Channel S, and TV One.
- Our team dedicated efforts to review and update the Darul Uloom & Jami Mosque Islamic Centre website. Additionally, we are in the process of designing and developing a new website for the Raheem Academy
- We continued our live streaming services, covering the full Taraweeh this year, as well as ongoing live broadcasts of Jum'ah Khutbah and various events on Facebook and YouTube.

- Our online radio reached an impressive 10,000+ individuals. Furthermore, our analogue radio scanner reached a similar audience of 10,000+. In addition, we successfully implemented a digital radio scanner, operating via Wi-Fi, allowing people nationwide to tune in once it is programmed to our channel.

Social Media Insights:

- JMIC's website experienced significant growth, with an average of 800 daily visitors and a total of 300,000 page views over the year.
- Our Facebook page reached 38,000+. However, there was a decrease in Facebook video views.
- In the 2022-23 period, our Google Business profile showed promising results, with 1,459 people making calls using the profile, 27,078 people visiting the website through Google, and a total of 150,957 views of the Google Business profile.

These achievements showcase our continuous efforts to connect with the community and enhance our online presence, with positive trends in website traffic, social media engagement, and Google profile performance.

Committee of Volunteers for Development (CVD)

Alhamdulillah, The CVD team has continued its support towards the JMIC and continuously aims to improve the centre whilst attending to all *Musalli* needs. CVD has managed to increase their activities. This year CVD has managed to increase its good number of manpower. They have thus become the first line of communication for *Musallis* of JMIC. The activities and the operational methods are summarised below:



Friday Jum'ah Activities

The CVD team plays a pivotal role in the coordination of Friday Jum'ah activities on a consistent basis. These activities encompass various tasks such as collecting donations within the Masjid, maintaining order, guiding Musallis as they exit the Masjid, managing the car park, directing Musallis inside, ensuring optimal space utilization, and counting donations. This year, we've had a dedicated team of 20-25 CVD members performing these roles every Friday.

Qadr Night

During significant events like Lilatul Qadr, CVD members voluntarily dedicate their entire night. They actively participate alongside other Musallis in collecting donations and serving Suhoor. This year, approximately 25 CVD members took part, supporting around 500 Musallis during this special night.

Ramadan

The holy month of Ramadan is a bustling time for the Masjid, especially during Taraweeh prayers. CVD members contribute by supervising children inside the Masjid, engaging in various activities, collecting donations, maintaining order, and guiding Musallis as they leave the Masjid, as well as assisting with the car park. About 10-15 CVD members consistently engage in these tasks throughout the month.

Eid Day

Alhamdulillah, JMIC once again successfully organized open-air Eid Jamaahs in the Darul Uloom playgrounds, accommodating both male and female visitors. The CVD team takes charge of all aspects of the day, from Fajr Salah to the final Jamaat of the day. Key responsibilities on this day include preparing the Eidgah for both male and female attendees, arranging sound systems, managing the car park, collecting donations, guiding Musallis, and ensuring efficient space utilization. Approximately 40 CVD members are actively involved during these joyous and auspicious occasions.

Cleaning the Masjid



CVD members actively engage in cleaning both the interior and exterior of the Masjid, including the Ablution area. They also undertake litter picking in the vicinity of JMIC. This important task is consistently carried out by about 20 CVD members on a regular basis.

JMIC Events

CVD members actively contribute to the planning and execution of various events hosted by the JMIC. These events encompass activities such as the Mosque open day, Winter Conference, and the Weekly Talabul Ilm program. Their roles involve welcoming attendees, providing guidance, distributing food, and ensuring smooth logistics during these events. It's noteworthy that the CVD team regularly convenes for events preparation meetings to ensure the success of these occasions and to facilitate their seamless execution for the JMIC community.
